

Natural Disaster (FEMA declared)

An employee may qualify for financial assistance in securing a new residence (if fully displaced), help with hotel reimbursement (if temporarily displaced) and/or replacing essential furniture, appliances, or clothing that was destroyed by a FEMA declared natural disaster. Cracker Barrel Cares uses the employee's physical address to confirm that they reside in a FEMA declared natural disaster area. Other available resources such as FEMA, American Red Cross and insurance policies should be utilized before applying for a Cracker Barrel Cares grant to ensure the program is available to help those most in need.
